HIGH IMPACT PRACTICE

- 2023-Present: Implementing H5P (AI tool) to improve the quality of online teaching by the IT dept at SPH.
- Online Maternal and Child Health course was updated using AI.
 - Recorded lectures included captions, prompts, quizzes, and flash cards.
 - Online interactive textbook became available to students.
 - Students performed much better than previous years and even better compared to the face-to-face class
- 2021- Present Implementing a game-based learning tool using jeopardy application by the IT dept. at SPH.
- PHLT 305 (Fundamentals of Epidemiology) course
 - Students play the game of jeopardy once a semester to review educational material
 - Students write a summary of what they learn during the game
 - Students reportedly perform better on their exams since the implementation of this tool
- 2019-Present Inviting guest speakers from different disciplines of epidemiology
- PHLT 305 (Fundamentals of Epidemiology) course (classes up to 250 students)
 - Invited guest speakers from infectious disease epi, social epi, census, on-campus data driven research centers, and global health to explain the use of epi in their work.
 - Students provided positive feedback and it resulted in multiple students' placement for summer internships or permanent jobs.
